LICADHO is a national Cambodian human rights organization. Since its establishment in 1992, LICADHO has been at the forefront of efforts to protect civil, political, economic and social rights in Cambodia and to promote respect for them by the Cambodian government and institutions. Building on its past achievements, LICADHO continues to be an advocate for the Cambodian people and a monitor of the government through wide ranging human rights programs from its main office in Phnom Penh and 13 provincial offices.

LICADHO has two specific programs,

1. Monitoring & Protection Program: Monitoring of State Violations, Women's & Children's Rights; Medical Assistance & Social Work; Prison Monitoring; and Paralegal & Legal Representation.
2. Promotion & Advocacy Program: Supporting Unions, Grassroots Groups & Networks; Training & Information; and Public Advocacy & Outreach.

LICADHO recently published a new report, *No Punishment, No Protection: Cambodia's Response to Domestic Violence*. It presents evidence of the failure of the Cambodian justice system to properly protect victims of domestic violence or to punish the perpetrators.
